

When a Language Test Result is Not Required

A language test result is always required, unless you have:

Completed a degree of higher education in English in an EU/EEA country, Australia, Canada, New Zealand, Switzerland, United Kingdom or the U.S.A.

- *Degrees completed in English on overseas campuses located in a country not included on the list of countries mentioned above are accepted if the main university is located in one of the countries listed.*
 - *The level of the degree completed must be equivalent at least to the minimum required degree giving you the eligibility to apply to the programme.*
 - *The fact that the language of education was English must be mentioned on the Degree Certificate, Diploma Supplement, Transcript of Records or, on a separate official document provided by the institution of higher education issuing the degree.*
 - *In case of proving the required language skills in English with another degree apart from the one providing you with the eligibility to apply, you must have completed that degree and graduated by the application deadline.*
- Completed your degree in Finnish or Swedish in a Finnish University or University of Applied Sciences
 - *In case of proving the required language skills in English with another degree apart from the one providing you with the eligibility to apply, you must have completed that degree and graduated by the application deadline.*
