# **Conference location**

### How to get to the campus

Buses number 1 and 5 serve the campus. Bus number 1 goes via the city center, bus number 5 from the train station via the city center. The easiest and most reliable way to buy a bus ticket on the bus is with cash. A one-way ticket costs 3,60€. The buses run between 6 am and 11 pm. 
### What the campus looks like




All rooms that we use for the conference are close to one another.

All are in the part of the building encircled with blue:



On the ground floor you get into the building, rooms 1245 and 1247 are on the 1sr floor, and rooms 1318, 1345 and the piano room are on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor.

room. Online participants can use this time to signal their presence to the session chair and to do a technical check.
